- 2. Read Philippians 4:4-9. What does it mean to rejoice in the Lord? (v4) Why do you think he specifies "always"? Describe how it might be possible to do this even in hard times.
- 3. What are we allowed to be anxious about or worried (v6)?
- 4. What are we supposed to do when we are anxious about something? Why do you think we need to "let your requests be made known to God?"
- 5. How does praying bring peace? (v7) Is it because God promises to answer our every request or is it something else? (Hint: Why would prayers that bring peace have to be done "with thanksgiving"? When you think about praying, why is it important to remember "the Lord is near"?)
- 6. How might it affect the lives of the Philippians to live out Paul's command in verse 8? How might it affect the gospel ministry in Philippi?
- 7. To help decide what this list of things mean, think of an antonym (opposite) word for each of these things we are supposed to think about.
